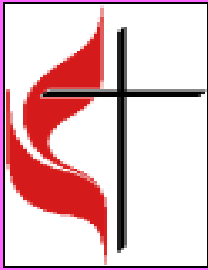

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Ever since I've been appointed to Lemont UMC in 2012, I've been listening to you and the leading of the Holy Spirit among us. I've heard your concerns, but more importantly, heard the dreams God has placed on your hearts. My role as your pastor is not to create a new vision, but rather to be the steward of the vision that God has revealed to us. That vision was to grow our ministry with children, youth and young families. We dreamed of growing in numbers and of being a missional church that blessed and served as Christ's hands & feet in our community.

For the past several months, I've been praying and envisioning about our congregation's strategic objectives. I've narrowed it down and now would like to invite you to consider the following three objectives: Blessing Children and Youth, Making New Disciples and Deepening Existing Ones, and Focusing Our Missional Impact.

1--Children and Youth: *"Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."* - Mark 10:14

Ongoing development of **Children Ministry** (Sunday School, game/movie night, talent show ...)
Ongoing development of **Youth Ministry** (Jr. High, Breakfast Club, Youth Group Outings ...)
Ongoing development of **Annual Community Outreach** (VBS, Last Supper Drama, Easter Egg Hunt, Thanksgiving Service, Carol of Lemont, Breakfast with Santa ...)

2--Discipleship: *"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."* - Matthew 28:19

Ongoing development of **Worship Services** that are welcoming and attractive to visitors.
Ongoing development of **Preaching** that addresses relevant life needs and questions of believers and non-believers and offer Christian discipleship.

Ongoing development of **Adult Discipleship Classes/Programs** that offer solid teaching on Basis of Christianity (Alpha) and Deepening Christian Faith (Adult Sunday School, Lenten Study ...)

Ongoing development of **Small Groups** that nurtures loving relationships (Choir, Care Bears, United Methodist Men, Primetimers, Young Couple ...)

Ongoing development of **Marketing/Publicity** aimed at introducing faith to our neighbors (Mass mailings, local events, local community expos ...)

3--Mission: *"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."* - Matthew 25:40

Ongoing support of **Missional Ministries:** Weekly Food Pantry, Wednesday Bread Day, Monthly DayBreak Shelter, Yearly Free Flu Shots, and Feed My Starving Children.

Ongoing development of **Youth Summer Camp and Mission Trips.** (Red Bird and local mission)

For the next few years, these objectives will guide the ongoing development of our ministry. I invite each of you to consider your role as individuals and families in helping us accomplish them. These objectives are only as effective as they are embraced by our leadership and larger church family.

OK-it's cold outside, not to mention that white stuff that you tried to maneuver, but now you're inside, maybe comfortably seated, etc. time to pick up a good book.

A good Christian book I'd recommend is "Borders of the Heart" by Chris Fabry. Chris has a weekday radio program on Moody. 90.1 on your radio dial. He is from West Virginia, has lots of kids, used to live in Bolingbrook (while he was there he wrote a column for "The Met" (the Norfleet newspaper on the stands for about twenty years-yes I'm prejudice and don't mind tooting the Norfleet horn.) Anyway, Chris has experienced a lot, has dealt with so many learning experiences...not only with his kids, but with relationships with the many people that his large family and many living situations have come into contact with.

So he set his story in Arizona, and introduces us to a young man who is put into a situation that forces him to make a Choice. That Choice segues into a thrilling, and scary, race for him. Please read.

A little book by James Dobson "In the Arms of God" has pictures and thoughtful sayings...ideas that are worth meditating on. All the thoughts are backed up by verses from the Bible. For instance, one of my favorites, is the thought that we should "never assume God's silence or inactivity is evidence of his disinterest."

"Wait on the Lord, and keep his way, and he shall cause thee to inherit the land:..."

Well I don't want to inherit the land, but it is nice to know that the Creator of the world, has a good plan for me."

"Heaven" is a book for kids that charmingly explains where their canine friend went. I don't know about you, but I have always found this to be a difficult subject to discuss with young boys or girls. Personalizing the dog who goes to heaven and the little girl who misses him afterwards seems to be one explanation.

Dogs do seem to have an uncanny, God given?, sense of future events, except when they are responding to an owner's request, like the time my dog was hit by a car because I stupidly called to him.

However, I also have experienced dogs who were sick and knew they were dying, yet tried to respond to me. Anyway, enough of this morose rambling, I really think this book's topic might be relevant and worth the time to read or read to a young one experiencing such a loss.

"Seeds of Heaven" is another book for young people. In it an adult points out the many different "seeds of heaven" made by our Creator: the sand and the water nearby, the buds on a tree which become leaves, the flowers and wheat that spring from seeds that are planted; the birds of the air, and sometimes their nests filled with eggs which become more birds; trees, and how did they grow?, pearls in oyster shells, the knowledge we all have, birds and man, to understand how God wants us to fulfill our needs. This book tells the story with beautiful pictures, and bible verses.

General Fund beginning balance:	\$ 212

This is the next in a series of articles about stewardship. In these articles I will try to inform you about the many ways you can contribute to your church's programs.

"Excitement and Worry"

Wow! Did you see the General Fund ending balance for December? I think that \$20,000 is the highest ending balance that we have ever had for this fund. The prayers of the Finance Committee have certainly been answered! This was of course the result of generous giving on Christmas and throughout December as many of you celebrated that wonderful day and strived to complete your financial pledge for the year.

Speaking of pledges, I am afraid that pledging for the new year has been disappointingly low so far. The number of pledges received is down 24% and the amount pledged to all funds is down by 16%. I must apologize if the fault for this situation is mine – did I talk too much or too little or did I say the wrong things? Hopefully it is because many have forgotten to turn in their pledge cards. Your pledges will be welcome at any time and there are still cards in the church pews for you to use.

This big start for the General Fund in 2015 could be considered an opportunity for new and exciting goals and activities for our church, but the drop in pledging will no doubt get the Finance Committee worrying. Let me wish you all a happy new year and another successful year of mission for our church.

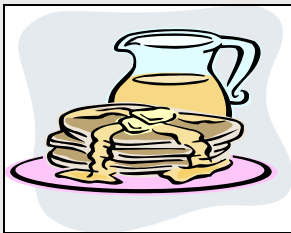
