Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"O give thanks to the LORD, call on his name, make known his deeds among the peoples." 1 Chronicles 16:8

Throughout the Bible, we are commanded to be thankful. A spirit of thanksgiving is one of the most distinctive marks of a Christian whose heart is attuned to the Lord. First, we are to be thankful for all the blessings God gives us. Some people are never satisfied with what they have. But what a different it makes when we realize that everything we have has been given to us as gifts from God.

Second, we must never forget to thank God for the people in our lives. St. Paul said to the people of Philippi, "I thank my God every time I remember you." Phil. 1:3. It is so easy to take them for granted, or to complain, or become angry because they don't meet our every wish. But we need to give thanks for our spouse, our children, our relatives, our friends, and our neighbor. Most of all, thank God for Christ and his love us for us.

Third, we must thank God in the midst of trials and even persecution. St. Paul was separated from friends, unjustly accused, brutally treated and severely suffered in a harsh Roman prison. But look at what he wrote during his prison experience: "Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Eph. 5:19-20. St. Paul's advice still holds truth to us today for two reasons:

- 1) Thankfulness takes the sting out of adversity. As we give God's thanks regardless how we feel, God will give us joy, regardless of our circumstances. This may sound irrational and at times impossible. But it is an act of obedience. When we obey God in this way we will experience joy even through difficulties.
- 2) Thankfulness opens our hearts to God's presence and our minds to God's thoughts. Although nothing has changed, we are still under a rock and in a hard place. However, we can see a light at the end through the dark. This empowers us to see from God's perspective and trust in God's faithfulness. During this Thanksgiving season, may we focus on a thankful attitude and anticipate spiritual blessings to fall freely onto us. St. Thomas S. Monson once said, "Sincerely giving thanks not only helps us recognize our blessings, but it also unlocks the doors of heavens." Let everyday be Thanksgiving Day.



Books Available in the Library By Kay Norfleet

"Going Public with Your Faith"

I chose this book because of its title, and how I thought it fit in with our purpose: evangelizing. We've been studying James during church, and one of the main things James points out is that a Christian's works are more convincing to others than just talk. Our character convinces people of Who we represent. Our actions keep people coming back to hear the Word. Perhaps no one wants to read this book all the way through. However, the chapters describe several particular points that might be of interest. I found that the chapter on "Earning the Right to be Heard" had a few pointers. Perhaps you'll find another. One of the main ideas in the book is that your prayers, asking for wisdom about evangelizing to someone, deepen your relationship with God and will be most helpful. You can relate your Biblical understanding to current situations in the secular world which the other knows about. If you don't see immediate change in the person you are evangelizing just remember you will have planted the seed. God says He will do the rest.

"Moms' Night Out"

This is the story of a celebration of mothers-from several walks of life. God knows that mothers are special. They are special because they try to be mothers. What God intended when he designed mothers. They try to bring up their children according to the way God would like. However, and I know that you mothers understand, sometimes mothers just need a little time to themselves-a night out. This book of fiction, although I don't really think all of it is fiction, tells the frantic tale of three moms and their night out that took a weird turn. The movie is fun and funny, too.

"Praying the Gospel of John"

The writers believe that John is the cornerstone of the Christian faith. They offer 52 experiences and historical backgrounds to back up that premise. The entire gospel is a description of Christ, The mysteries of Christ are explored. Your prayers will necessarily reflect that you have studied the historical background and commentary. Christ used many teachable moments in front of his followers. They are recorded here for us. Christ linked himself to the Old Testament covenants and proved to his followers that He is and was the great "I AM." The gospel of John gives us sight and ability to grasp that Christ's powers are not to be put in a box Every day we experience a new adventure in living for Christ. Pay attention!

"Thanksgiving Graces"

This is an easy read, picture book that prepares us for the special day set aside for thankfulness. As the main character learns, thanksgiving is NOT only about the food-though that is special-but the people involved. HAPPY THANKSGIVING to us all, and let's remember to practice thanksgiving a lot.



The Greatest Friend

I have just come to the realization that we have a great and wonderful friend we may not even know. I was recently reading in John's Gospel in the Upper Room Discourse on Christ's last evening with his disciples and chapters 13-16 where the facts began to appear to me of our friend Jesus. For example, I see Him saying in 12:46-50 that, "I am the light that has come into the world so that all who believe in me won't have to stay any longer in the dark" (v.46 Message).

Then Jesus proceeded to wash the disciple's feet like a common servant and tell them to do the same (13:12). Then He gave them a new command to "love one another" (13:34-35) and in John 14:2-4 He tells them He will soon go back to heaven to prepare a home for them and later return to gather them. Then a remarkable and wonderful verse says, "The person who trusts me will do even greater things than I have done" (14:12), and, "Whatever you request (in prayer) in this way, I'll do" (14:14). This leads us to the way in which these things will happen that follows.

The Good News Bible from the American Bible Society and other translations describe the Holy Spirit sent from the Father to be with them and us as the "Helper" but the Message translation uses the term "another Friend (like Christ) so that you will always have someone with you and calls Him the "Spirit of Truth" (14:16). The Good News Bible says, "You know Him, for He remains with you and lives in you" (14:17). Later Jesus says the Friend will make everything plain to you and remind you of all the things I have told you (14:25-26). In chapter 15 Jesus teaches them the parable or principle of the Vine and the branches with abiding. I have just selected from my computer music library a new playlist on this to make a CD to enjoy and share.
