

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The season of Advent--the four Sundays leading up to Christmas Day is a special time for us. It challenges us to pause and remember the hope we have during a stressful season that all too often emphasizes on greed and spending. Advent allows us the time and space to refocus our hearts and minds of Jesus--the true hope of the season. This year Advent comes to us early. It begins on Sunday, November 29th, and we will start an exciting new Advent program, *Under Wraps: The Gift We Never Expected. Prepared and piloted by The Woodlands United Methodist Church in Houston, this joyful program explores some of God's unexpected qualities, presented over the four weeks of Advent, plus the fifth week for Christmas Eve:*

- 1. November 29th--God Is Expectant
- 2. December 06th--God Is Dangerous
- 3. December 13th--God Is Jealous
- 4. December 20th--God Is Faithful
- 5. Christmas Eve -- A Season of Joy

Just as the first wrapped gift beneath the Christmas tree marks the new season, so the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day signaled that God's hope and salvation and redemption plan had come into the world. In Jesus, God gift-wrapped himself in human flesh and was born in a stable so he could come and live among us and offer us life and salvation that we could never gain on our own.

I invite you to join in and commit with us for the next five weeks as we explore the character of God. Let's use this opportunity to invite our family, friends, and neighbors so they too can explore God's character. I encourage you to take time to reflect, meditate, and pray, asking God to do a great work in our hearts as we remember the great gift given to us through his Son. God expects something amazing to happen in our lives at Christmas. During this Advent, let's unwrap God's greatest gift, our Savior Jesus Christ.

Books Available in the Library By Kay Norfleet

I suggest the reading for the Christmas season is the Christmas story (**non-fiction**) found in Matthew 1: 18-25, Matthew 2: 2-12, Luke 1: 26-38 and 2: 1-20. These passages describe the GREATEST GIFT. Please don't just read them, thank God, worship, and be so filled with joy that you experience a wonderful holiday season that stretches throughout the year.

After that, a book I should have reviewed in November is "The Family Advent Reader-Handel's Messiah" the short stories are paired with the words of Handel's Messiah. Handel's Messiah is a piece written for Handel's worship and to remind us all to worship. Most recognize and have sung it many times. Concerts have been built around it. In olden days, as now, it was recognized as a truly great piece of work. Handel was in touch with God. That is evident.

The book recognizes the need to worship and presents an outlet to satisfy this need, besides offering little stories to go along and explain the words.

"Christmas Miracles" is another non-fiction to remind us of the true meaning of Christmas-Christ. The stories reflect Christ's promise that He came to give us hope-He will never leave us-His help is ever present. We only have to Trust and Obey. "Trust and Obey for there's no other way...."

Another short story book, this time fiction, gathers together Christmas stories written by Laura Ingalls Wilder, Frank Capra, James Thurber, John Cheever to name a few.

These Christmas stories reflect the author's understanding of Christ-mas giving. Giving to others is Christ's nature, isn't it? They can be construed as Miracles. Miracles occur when giving; when Christ is giving to us and when He is giving to others through us. We just need to be grateful for each gift. After all, if He created the world and us, what's a miracle? Just be on the lookout and when one occurs, give thanks-worship the One who blesses us. That's what He made us for isn't it?

For the kids(you might have to help read) "The Trees of the Dancing Goats." The most memorable passage is when Grampa says "miracles can happen every day." And they can. They do in this story.

Next "the Littlest Angel." Another miracle at Christmas is described. But really, Christmas is not the only time miracles can occur. We just need to acknowledge them and thank God.

The fictional tale of 12 cats is a take on the "Twelve Days of Christmas." Beautiful picture book.

Anyone wanting a large print book should read Tim LaHaye's-author of the Left Behind series- "The Secret of Ararat." It's the story of a man seeking Noah's Ark. You know the Bible story of Noah's Ark, now it is expanded a bit.



Last Sunday the Sr. High Youth Group had the pleasure of a guest speaker-Judy, a Hearing Interpreter from the Lemont High School. Using games and internet exercises, she helped us understand what it might be like to have a physical disability. She explained how she got became a hearing interpreter, helped us understand some of the challenges they face and advances made to help the deaf, and encouraged us to get involved and "do something." When meeting a deaf person, she explained that we should face them and talk clearly so that they may read our lips to help with understanding. We should be friendly, inclusive, and helpful, just as we would for any other person that we meet. Judy reminded us that we all face challenges in our lives, whether they are physical or emotional or spiritual; the key is to not let them hold us back. A challenge can only become a disability if we let it. Conversely, God has given each of us strengths and she encouraged us to use them; find your passion and make the most of it!
