

Testimonies

I grew up on the east side of Joliet. I attended Sunday School in a Lutheran Church on the east side where I was baptized when I was 5 years old. I attended Lutheran Sunday School classes until I was 12 years old. At that time I started helping my father build a house on the west side of Joliet. We moved into the house when I was 13 years old and never returned to the Lutheran Church on the Joliet's east side. My family, for the most part, did not encourage my sisters or myself to attend church on the west side of Joliet like they did on the east side of Joliet. I got married in a United Methodist Church in Kalamazoo, MI when I was 22 years old.



moved back to Joliet, along with my new wife, and attended the Methodist Church there about 3 or 4 times. I never really felt comfortable in that church. It might have been because I felt I was really Lutheran, but it might have been because I felt out of place there. I once built a Catholic Church in Lansing, IL (St. Ann Catholic Church) where I became good friends with the Priest. I was considering converting to become Catholic and a member of that church, but I figured it was only due to my friendship with the Priest. Once the Priest was assigned to another Parish, then I figured my whole reason for becoming a Catholic and a member of that Church would have been gone.

The reason that I became interested in The Lemont United Methodist Church is mostly due to Peg Pecher. I really was not looking to become a member of a church at the time that I first visited the church. In talking with Peg, I could see how much she really loved being a part of this church. She talked about the warmth and love of the church membership. She talked about the activities that she was involved in. She talked about the friendships that she has established throughout the years of being a member. I decided that I had to check this church out for myself....as my past experiences with churches did not include warmth, love, and establishing friendships. My first time visiting the church I noticed that this was a very "hugging" type of church. I also noted to myself that it took Peg about 20 to 30 minutes to say hello to all of her friends after services and that the friendships that she described to me "seemed" very genuine. I had to see more. The next week was the same thing. The week after was the same thing. I sort of came to the conclusion that the warmth and love of the church membership, as Peg described to me, was indeed real. So, I kept attending. In attending services I noticed that I started reconnecting with God. I found that, during the course of my life, I had lost that connection. I found that re-establishing that connection with God, I started looking forward to the Sunday services as a spiritual healing and enhancement. I participated in classes on the "Creed" at Pastor Oh's house. The classes on the "Creed" and in reading the book, was really a spiritual eye-opener for me in many ways. The things taught to me in my youth in Sunday School, seemed to have had my belief in God in parts and pieces that did not seem, in many ways, to make sense. The classes on the Creed tied a lot of those pieces together. There were many times during those classes where I had a moment whereby I told myself "that is what I wanted to know", or "that makes more sense". Also, I cannot say enough about Pastor Oh as a spiritual leader. She has enabled my re-connection with God and religious enhancement to take place.

So yes, Peg Pecher brought me to this church, but the warmth, love, and friendship of the members, along with the spiritual healing, religious enhancement, and re-connecting with God has me coming back and wanting to become a member. I want this to become my church too.

Environmental Stewardship

A program on TV, "It Is Written" covered the issue of environmental stewardship, corruption, and poisoning. A question was asked, "Is God an environmentalist?" and answered, "Yes, He created everything and said, "it is good." Does He care what we do about the earth's environment? Yes, He gave early man the job of being a good steward and caring for the environment

Warning signs are all around us, such as the drought in the Middle East and Africa, so no longer are they able to support their own people and millions of people are refugees looking for new usable land and peace. War has made whole countries destroyed and unable to support its people, like Sudan. The earth was created as a system that works together until it is changed by mankind. It was created as a perfect system but then decay, pollution, and chaos began and is accelerating. 3.5 billion people now live on lass than \$2.50 a day.

The frequency of natural disasters is increasing, along with greater intensity. Facts were shown, like the frequency of natural disasters since 1980 and in the next 25 years the oceans will be fished out and this is a major food source for many. Algae blooms, enhanced by polluted runoff water, are becoming serious, along with acidification. We can now see from satellites areas in the ocean that are dead with no signs of life. Last year we consumed more food than we produced and this trend will continue. We now see new kinds of dangerous bacteria and viruses that cannot be cured, so deaths are increasing. Using antibiotics in cattle and chickens are creating resistance to these pathogens in people from regular consumption. Beef and pork are also taking a lot of land, feed, and waste that pollutes (especially pork). Coal mining is dangerous and generates many kinds of wastes that pollute. We forget that the environment is a branch of science.

June 2018 book reviews

"Larger than Life Lara" "When Lara Phelps walks into Laney Grafton's fourth-grade class, Laney feels the air change. Lara is fat. Really fat. Finally, there will be someone else for the boys to pick on, Laney thinks. But as the class prepares for the school play, Lara doesn't act the way a fat kid should. She's confident. She's happy. And nothing, it seems, can change her positive attitude. Until one day, when Laney's classmates do the unthinkable." And Laney thinks Lara's actions might not be kind. But what a story twist! Lara does the unthinkable in response. Dandi, the author, shows us in a story what a story is...it's a character reacting to a situation. This book is for kids in grades 4-6. Think! What does the Lord always ask of us? The book answers that question.

And the next book reinforces: "Daily Acts of Kindness" Is a devotional to give us ideas of how to reveal, give, and find God's Love. The book suggests, in very short stories, how distressing acts may prompt kind answers. "Don't be concerned for your own good but for the good of others." 1 Corinthians 10:24 A good reminder for all of us is Proverbs 17:17-"A friend is always loyal, and a brother (and who is your brother?) is born to help in time of need." In short, kindness is ALWAYS the correct response. In some cases it can be tempered with firmness-but KINDNESS should prevail. "Being slow to anger" is also an idea from God, and is a concept to incorporate. Don't know about you, but with all the evil in the world, sometimes our kindness can be forgotten-then it's time, as always, to ask the Lord "what to do."

The audiobook of "The Hiding Place" presents a way to "read" a book (for those of you who are feeling a bit rushed or rather tired of exerting yourselves.) You will find a way to relive the world in which Corrie and Bessie ten Boom were some of the unlikely heroines of WW2.

"Cars and Trucks" is a 'Little Golden Book' for youngsters. It's by Richard Scarry who provides illustrations that poke at the child's ability to see all. (Perhaps the reader can improve language the child's language by identifying each car, truck, or each picture.)

"How to be a Perfect Christian" is a book written with A "tongue in cheek' slant. The chapters: "Joining the right church" "Worshiping like a pro," "Doing life together," "Serving in church without lifting a finger," "Looking really spiritual online," and so on, might expose you as not so perfect, unless you are...oh, come on! But, in the end, we must acknowledge that the Lord knows who we are, and that is why He sent His Son, THE PERFECT ONE, to die for OUR SINS. We may never be the perfect Christian on our own, but He has given us a Way.

I've added a small book "Too Blessed to be Stressed- 3 minute devotions for women". The book reminds us of situations that almost overpower and how we should perceive them.
