September -2018, Book Reviews

"The Reason for Sports" A Christian Fanifesto

This book is an opinion piece by a man who has lived and assimilated sports facts since high school days, BUT it also contains factual stories about such sports people as Mike Tyson, Rick Williams, Tony Dungy, Tom Brady, and high school athletes, for example. In all sports, the people who play them, need to have HUMILITY: that is the point of the book, that is the trait that the writer believes ought to be the practice of athletes-and, let's face it- all of us. Excerpt: "For Williams and Tyson, learning not to loathe themselves, and learning something about God, and the meaning of life in the process, seems to be a much bigger deal (than their sports.)" Humility, an open mind, whatever you want to call it, is a God-inspired practice. The reason for sports ought not to be an opportunity to cheat, opportunity for pride, opportunity for greed but a chance to display God-given talent. To paraphrase Tony Dungy-remain humble when you do well and keep a decent attitude when you lose-you're reporting to God.

"Nine Fruits of the Spirit: PATIENCE

Patience is a virtue from God...a precious jewel...which the book wants us to focus on and practice...in order to have a more fruitful life for God. It is most often demonstrated in our relations with others. "Lack of patience can destroy relationships." You know this is true. Can you think of any examples? Of course, having patience doesn't mean you are passive. At that time, practicing the other fruits, kindness, honesty, joy, charity, peace, kindness, goodness, long-suffering (enduring your or others' imperfections), gentleness, faith, modesty (acknowledging achievements from God), self-control, and chastity. Now those should keep you busy...and pleasing to God.

"101 Ways to Love Your Grandkids"

A lot of these suggestions are for those who have young grandkids. However, some of us don't. In these situations, it is helpful that WE memorize some encouraging verses from the Bible, such as: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4:6 OR "I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle: be patient, bearing with one another in love. Ephesians 4:1-2

But for others with little ones sharing memories like when my husband used to let our granddaughter dance on top of car-kind of silly, but fun for both; recently I went to 'grandparents day' with the youngest grandson-it was at his school-talk about a lot of walking! But it was great when he ran out of class to meet and hug me, even though he couldn't tell the teacher my name-I was just grandma. You have your memories...this book just suggests some more.
