Loneliness Addiction

Our church, Lemont United Methodist Church (LUMC) had a sermon today on loneliness, which I found very interesting. I never realized it could be an addiction but usually out of our control. My interest in widows comes partially from this problem that is common to widows and widowers. Some of my dearest friends were and are widows, like Greta Hayes and Ellen Davey and I miss them.

For some comfort I turn to the Bible where we are assured we won't be alone ever again and one of my favorite Gospel songs, "I Am Loved." Another great song is, "Go Rest High On That Mountain" written by Vince Gill when his brother died. It helps to remember who our best friends are, starting with our dear Lord Jesus, who said to his disciples, "You are my friends." People will let you down sometimes but not the Lord.

It is encouraging to the elderly in nursing homes to visit them or "home alone." Most widows have family or friends to visit them and help care for them. But this problem is related to growing up without friends or other children to play with and being involved in activities like scouts or church. I am an only child so I basically grew up alone and had few friends until I got involved in working part-time. Maybe I enjoyed running as a young man because I met and ran with others. Our sermon reminded us from Genesis, that "It is not good for man to be alone."

Books Available in the Library By Kay Norfleet

October 2018 Book Reviews

"Moms' Night Out" is not an especially religious book unless you include focusing on family, family situations, stressed-out Moms, trying. Sound familiar? The moms in the book have children under 18, however, I believe that any of us moms whose kids maybe twenty or beyond can relate to situations suggested. Sometimes I just want to say "OFORGOODNESSAKES-I do have a mind, you know." I don't tell them that sometimes it works and sometimes... Laugh...they (whoever they are), but I know, it makes me feel good to laugh. This is an almost believable piece of fiction? That might appeal.

Next, a more serious, yet not always so, book on" Praise, Anxiety, and other Symptoms of Grace." This is a compilation of short opinion pieces that specify grace. Grace which is, according to the Internet, the unmerited favor of God which manifests itself in salvation and blessings. And it is the author's main idea that grace abounds. Just look around and up. Again remember, urges the author, all of us are not just objects-get to know the other usimagine our lives-remind yourself of your God's grace which none of us deserve (do I really need to remind you?) To the author, grace entered this world in human form, for instance the Christ child. Now that's GRACE. We need to realize, regard, respect that his entrance and teachings offer grace to all. Shouldn't we do likewise: offer grace (respect others being one way) and offer understanding to all. Of course! No matter if the person is someone you really don't like, you need to offer him grace. Then move on and find someone you do respect. Someone who is offering grace to you. ie. Someone who listens. And GRACE, my friends, is the point of the book.

"Canoeing the "Mountains" is a book that was recommended by the current District Superintendent of our group of churches. (He said it took him only a plane ride to read....well he must have been going to South America somewhere because it took me a bit more than that.) The book tackles the topic of churches exploring uncharted territory. Just as Lewis and Clark did long ago. Those uncharted territories often have to do with conflict in the church and/or decreasing populations in the church or??? The author encourages those who encounter these problems to remain calm, yet focused on identifying problems (mountains) and using God-given minds to solve problems. Lewis and Clark were asked to explore to find a way to connect the Atlantic and Pacific by waterway. All went well UNTIL they went west of the Mississippi, then they ran up against mountains (problems). They had to use their minds to find a way around the mountains so others could move from the Atlantic to the Pacific.` We need to realize what we need to learn to keep the church healthy and growing: Be open to new ideas and find a new route.


Open Pantry
