From The Pastor's Heart...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When I walked Pixie, my dog, the other day, she directed me to a neighbor's house with furniture on their lawn. The owner came out, greeted me for the first time and openly shared with me that that day was a "bitter sweet" day for him. His granddaughter and great grandson were born 12 hours apart yesterday and today, his youngest son is moving out. He showed pictures of his family, then reached into his pocket and took out a stack of 1x2 cards which look like business cards. He said to me, "I like to give this "Prayer of Forgiveness" to you but if you don't want to take it then let me have it back." I told him that I will keep it and share with others. He then responded, "There you go." On our way home, I thought, "What a natural and relational way to evangelize. "Could this be what Jesus is telling John's messengers: *"Go and tell them what you see and hear?"* (Matthew 11:5)

For 2014, I am recommitting myself to being a better neighbor. We all know that for such a task no one can fulfill it alone. Recognizing that fact, I am asking you for help. Would you journey with me on a path of radical, passionate, and intentional evangelism? First, make time for devotion daily then earnestly listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit as we go about our everyday activities. Second, faithfully write down 2-5 names of people who do not or seldom attend church. Third, fervently pray daily for the names on our list. Every morning and/or evening, lift up these names during our prayer times. Continually ask God to bless them and then bless us with opportunities to be a blessing for them in practical and tangible ways; such as offering a listening ear, a word of encouragement, or a helping hand. As time goes by, extend an invitation for coffee, lunch, or Sunday Worship Service. Fourth, purposefully act on the opportunities that arise. When we get a chance to invite people to Sunday worship services or special programs, be sure to offer to pick them up or meet them ahead of time to sit and be with them during and after the service. Remember to introduce them to others and extend another invitation for them to return. As we all experienced, when we pray, God blesses both--the ones we pray for and the one who prays. When we engage and start praying specifically for people in our lives, God will open our hearts and equip our bodies so we can partake in the Mission of God.

As we continue to do what the Lord is required of us: *"Do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God."* People will come to trust the message about God's love. May our neighbors experience God's love through us and accept our invitation to come and worship God with us.

*Wishing you and your family a happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year.
May your each and every day of 2014 be full of grace and blessings from God.*

Books Available in the Library by Kay Norfleet

**A book that might interest teens and adults- women and men-is "[The Reason for Sports-A Christian Fanifesto](#)".

The book is a series of essays written by this sports-minded Christian, with the emphasis on Christian. He ties his sports and Christianity together and tells us how Christian values can be reflected in sports by the people who are playing or directing. So whether you're a pro or weekend hockey or football or any movement fan (fantasy football included), this book might apply to you.

He talks about Christian-sports "stars"-Lovie Smith, Tom Brady, and Tony Dungy, for example. He looks at how to develop a Christian theology of sports as some people have done or "I will do anything that promotes me" attitude. Some sports players feel they need to take steroids, but others offer themselves as "REAL" players. They use the talent God gave them And they apply Christian principles as they play: Truthfulness, honesty, humility, repentance and others...Christian athletes are not prideful. Some mothers and fathers would do well to read this book if their child is thinking about a sport. Kids can play sports and be a light to their team. They can realize that they need God's principles. They can put on the armor of God: righteousness, truth, faith...adults could show them how.

**This next book is more of a reference book: "[A Reasonable Response](#)".

The chapters "On Believing and Knowing," "On Argumentation and Logic." "God and Time," "On the Problem of Evil" and on and on are enabling to you and, hopefully, will allow you to talk to others about tough questions on God, Christianity and the Bible.

Have you ever been confronted by an atheist who said, "why did God allow...Katrina or the more recent typhoon in the Philippines or those people to burgle my house." I know that my short answer would be man has a fallen nature. Then I would go on to explain that the structures in New Orleans and the Philippines were created by man, and the burglars were evil in nature. The Fall of Man is explained in Genesis. But then the atheist might say but how can you believe the Bible. And I say there are many historical accuracies cited and I have faith. Then I'd go on to list why I have faith. Then the atheist says: what is this faith? And so it goes..."My goodness, this guy! Lord give me patience and wisdom."

**The next is for young kids, I think it's a primer for explaining to them that they can talk to God, and He'll listen to them. "[Dear God, Guess what, I'm ready to listen now!](#)" That's the book that says He wants to give a hint on the child's immediate problem, he wants the thank you after the hint. He wants an adult to start to explain His world and how He plans to fit the child into it.

I think it's for adults, too because we all know a little child is so impressionable but can offer amazing insights, we can all learn a lot by paying more attention to him... especially when he is learning about God.

Stewardship Minute

This is the next in a series of articles about stewardship. In these articles I will try to inform you about the many ways you can contribute to your church's programs.

"Christian Outreach"

As the year 2013 came to a close I began to consider what we have done in the past year as a church in the form of Christian outreach. After all, that is what it means to be a Christian – to reach out and help others.

Now, as the chair of the Stewardship/Finance Committee, I tend to look at the numbers – how much is contributed and where it goes. During 2013 over \$4,000 was collected in special offerings and outreach fundraisers. The major outreach effort of our church is contained in our monthly Conference Apportionment, the major portion of which goes to the world-wide outreach of the United Methodist Church. Our total Apportionment for 2013 was \$26,748. By the way, in recognition of our church's several local outreach programs, the conference has lowered our 2014 Apportionment by 4%.

So, what are these local outreach programs? Two are related to feeding the needy and the first is our Open Pantry program. Do you realize that nearly 1,000 people visit our pantry over the year and each receives a bag of groceries? To finance this operation, over \$2,000 is donated by church members and over \$20,000 by local businesses! Additionally, food is donated to the box in the church foyer and on occasion a pickup truck of food is sent by a person whose family was helped many years ago when he was a boy.

Our other major feed-the-needy program is our monthly dinner provision at the Daybreak Homeless Shelter in Joliet. With an average of 90 people fed by our church each month, it adds up to about 1,000 people each year.

2014 will see several of our members down in Kentucky at the Red Bird Mission doing some Christian outreach for needy families there. In fact, there are many more examples of Christian outreach by our church and its members. Keep up the good work!

The Greatest Obituary **By Richard H. Lee**

How much do you know about the character or identity of Jesus Christ? Obituaries give us the main identity of someone who has just died, but what would the obituary of Jesus say? And how much do you know from memory?

I think this is how it should go. Born in Bethlehem to Joseph and Mary as God's gift to man, also known as Immanuel or "God is with us." Announced by angels in glory and visited by kings from the east who followed the new star over Bethlehem (and came to worship the King).

Called his disciples, giving them power and truth. Giver of eternal life (John 3:16) and the honor of being born again of the Spirit. Healer of all who came, forgiving sins as their Savior. Teacher of the new covenant of faith and Revealer of god's nature (John 1:1, 14; 14:8-9). Showed the glory of god at his birth and on the mountain as he entered another dimension (Luke 9:28-36) with three of his closest disciples.

As king of the Kingdom of God (Luke 17:21) he entered the Holy City with praises of the common people, as soon he would become the Redeemer and pay the price for man's sin. He died as a criminal but was innocent, was buried, and rose again three days later as our Intercessor or Mediator with the Father. The first-born of a new race of spiritual beings who can understand the Scriptures (Luke 24:44-47; Romans 8:2, 9, 29). He shall return to gather his own on the Day of the Lord (John 14:3; Romans 8:15-19).

Paul also summarized the life of Jesus in 1 Timothy 3:16 and Isaiah the Prophet predicted all of Christ's roles in Isaiah 7:14 and 9:2-7 with some yet to come.

Did You Know 3

During the building of the Sanitary and Ship Canal from Chicago to the Illinois River in the 1890s, local "establishments" in the Smokey Row area had some property owners that were reputable and respected members of our church and some other churches. When this was discovered in the raids and hauling some business owners off to jail in Chicago, it was most embarrassing and even scandalous.

When the raids were over and things began to settle down, the Methodist Church area government decided to remove Reverend Clancy and send him to a peaceful community to settle down.
