





Books Available in the Library By Kay Norfleet

November 2017 book reviews

Here it is the holiday season. So here are some holiday books. A board book for the very young, explains "The Story of Thanksgiving." The book is about how one native American, Squanto, helped the Pilgrims, who didn't know much about growing food, hunting, and fishing so they wouldn't be hungry. Squanto saw their needs and was able to share his knowledge of the new land. They were grateful. So they invited their Native American friends to a feast. And besides enjoying the friendships, they ate turkey, fish, corn, beans pumpkins and squash. That was their thanksgiving. Bet yours is about the same. And speaking of Thanksgiving dinners enjoyed by you and family and friends where the menu is about the same, there is a book called "Thanksgiving Graces" which repeats thanks to God, just as the Pilgrims. This book is for those a little older and is filled with illustrations that represent the holiday. (But isn't giving thanks a practice we should be doing each day?)

A CD by Michael W. Smith, ushers into the Christmas season. He is a Christian singer whose songs reflect the Christian part of the Christmas season reminding us why. "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" and "Joy to the World" are two.

Also a DVD, "The Last Straw" a story about kindness and learning the true Christmas spirit. The spirit which is inspired by the arrival of the Savior.

Another board book, "One Small Donkey" explains an aspect of the Christmas story which offers another viewpoint from the donkey that Mary rode.
