
## Sanctuary Volunteers Are Needed!





## Books Available in the Library By Kay Norfleet

### August Book Reviews

"The God Cookie" I laughed at the dialogue until my laughter became more thoughtful, then I realized what was happening. God was in touch. God was making His wishes known to the main character, Parrish. Parrish was following God's instructions. The story is of one man whose only religious life had consisted of attendance at a church in his youth. He's no longer a youth. However, we know God was just waiting to pounce on him, and pounce He did... in a way that certainly was ...oh well, you'll see. I believe God made His point and Parrish won't stray again. The story was an imaginative journey that went on and on to not only convince Parrish of God but to show how God's purpose often takes several directions not only does He help the main character, Parrish (often that's you or me), but those helps result in our helping others. (And what kindness develops from God pointing the way.) Sort of makes you imagine what would happen if you were following God...or are you? If you feel that you are, and you have allowed God to direct your path, maybe you could (should) share your story by evangelizing?

"A Layman Looks at the Lord's Prayer" Of course, this is an opinion piece, but a thoughtful one. We begin the Lord's prayer by saying "Our Father." What a concept to address the one who created our world as a member of our family, whose character exudes love, although sometimes we do not understand because it's refining (not exactly what we understand)-remember everything God does works for good. God's love is not self-centered as so much of OUR love is. He sent His Son to die on the cross for YOU and ME-for our forgiveness that is the result of our decisions. He is omniscient-all knowing, omnipotent-all powerful, omnipresent-always with us (isn't all that comforting?) All He asks is that we believe in Him-believe in His power to help us live.

"Which art in Heaven" Possibly God, the Creator, is a spirit. Not a man. That's why we say "which." Can we wrap our minds around what He is? (After all, our minds are so limited, let's not limit His form.) We don't know what we don't know. Heaven is all around us in the galaxies He formed. He is omnipresent. There's more...WE DON'T KNOW WHAT WE DON'T KNOW.

"Hallowed be thy name" His divine mind has given us so much-we are continually uncovering what He has made. Isn't that a good enough reason to say "HOLY." YOU ARE "HOLY." For instance, often in a church the talks of the latest functions, the music, the building itself, are revered...the focus is not on God. His meeting place is HOLY. The same goes for our little lives-lives that God gave us- we ask, ask, ask. What we should be doing is more often is PRAISING HIM. He is Holy. Please read, and hopefully, you will have second thoughts when reciting the prayer.

An "e-mail from God -for Teens"(actually that's all of us, right?) Each e-mail begins with a passage from the Bible, then God explains. For instance, an e-mail: Proverbs 27:17 "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another," Dear Child (writes God), Some friends dull the edge of who you are by just hanging around you. They are time-wasters and procrastinators. Their thoughts are negative, their goals are shallow, and their ideas are weak. Other friends sharpen you and bring you into focus. They know what life is all about. They're not afraid to take a stand on spiritual issues-issues that count. You become a better person just by being around them. Their strength sharpens your character, and you become stronger, your strength sharpens theirs. Invest your time and energy and friendship in the second kind of friend. You won't regret it. Your Best Friend God OR, another Psalm 16:5-6 "Lord, you have assigned me, my portion and my cup; you have made my lot secure. The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; surely I have a delightful inheritance." Dear Child, Lots of people think being a Christian means missing out on the good stuff...That's not Me. I have a wonderful inheritance for you...so hang in there and trust me. I'm the One Who knows how to bless. Your Maker, God Yes, the messages in the e-mails are inspiring, but they also remind us to focus on HIM...learn about HIM...TRUST AND OBEY, THERE'S really NO OTHER WAY!

"Not Alone" by Miriam Neff, an audio book. This audio book is not only for widows "Our circumstances do not define our destinations." The author wants us to realize that that one phrase that should be an encouraging one, which should always be remembered and addressed in our prayers. We need wisdom, as these women knew they did. The audio book examines the lives of widows of the Bible, how their lives reflected positive qualities of God-reliance. She applies their actions to widows (and those who are not) of the present day to give them hope. After all, man plans and God laughs...isn't that the current thought. Let's try to address God's plans. Listen. Maybe we can get some insight.
