

## Combined Service and Brunch, Sunday, June 2nd



## **Witness to Christ by Tony Ferrazzi**

I learned so much about Peter from the book and in our study group. 1st and most obvious to me was how much I am like Peter was early on in his discipleship to Jesus, faithful yet flawed. Peter was faithful enough to fight for Jesus in the Garden when the soldiers came to take him away, and flawed enough to deny knowing Jesus just a few hours later when it was not popular or safe.

I'm sure if Jesus were here today; he would have called me Satan many times and asked me to get out of his way regardless of how much I thought I was trying to help.

I believe that Jesus is our Master and guides us thru life. Telling us to row a little further and cast our nets on the other side of the boat. Even inviting us to step out of the comfort of our own boat and walk with him in some of the most uncommon and uncomfortable situations. I think I am more likely to be like one of the disciples who stays huddled in the boat. But what this book has taught me is that no matter how much you love and follow Jesus, it's not until you step out of the boat in the middle of the sea, and do what you thought was once impossible to do that you will begin to understand Jesus and the place he has for you in his kingdom on earth.

And then there is the power of the Holy Spirit. Life changing, you bet. Peter sought the Holy Spirit and it was this gift of the Holy Spirit that tempered Peter into the true, brave and unwavering rock that the Christian church was built on. If we also seek the Holy Spirit, we too may be able to overcome our own flaws and be true Disciples of Christ.

## **The Call To Fish - By Emmie Linzaga**

In six topics of the study, we learned more about Peter who represented those who believe and seek to follow Jesus. What a great faith he had that when he was called by Jesus, he just followed without much questions and hesitation. Peter was chosen for his great role in the ministry of Christ. His three denials revealed the humanness in him; it was a trait of self-preservation. Bad as it may seemed, his action, I believed was planned by God, for if were not so, he would have been arrested and probably prosecuted and crucified along with Christ. Had that happened, there would not be a "Rock" from where the foundation of Christ's ministry was established.

One homework question we were given in the study was: "have you ever denied Jesus Christ in your life?" Initially, I said, "I don't recall any denial I made." But on second thought, I think I did on some occasions. Whenever I or any believers failed to pray and give thanks before a meal, whether at home or anywhere else, we are in a way, denying Christ. Giving thanks for all blessings we have is an acknowledgment of God and Christ's presence in our lives. With a near-death experience I had, eight years ago, lying in an emergency room and diagnosed with "abdominal, aortic, aneurysm", I felt peace and comfort; somehow I felt Jesus, the great physician was with me. There was a little fear and apprehension though as I had friends who did not make it through the ordeal. As I lay on the operating room, I just prayed and trusted everything to God. My trust, my faith and prayers pulled me through.

Our six and a half years of service in the local UMC in Hudson – FL, are testament of Christ living in our lives. Now, that we moved back to Illinois and here with you all, we intend to answer Christ's calling again to serve in anyway we can to our church's ministry. Finally, I want to summarize my faith thru an stanza of a Christian hymn: It may be in the valley, where countless dangers hide; It may be in the sunshine that I, in peace, abide; But this one thing I know—if it be dark or fair, If Jesus is with me, I'll go anywhere! ### **Peter**

One of the most important things I learned in the Bible Study class was that Peter was just an average person with faults and failings like the rest of us. He had great faith when he stepped outside his boat to walk on water and see Jesus, but then, as with us, he became afraid and fell into the water. He denied Jesus three times after his death as many of us would probably do.

Through all this Jesus forgave him. If we are truly sorry God will forgive us again and again. He is the God of second, third, and as many chances as we need. For me, this is a very comforting thought. I know that as long as I do my best, and ask forgiveness when I fail, the lord will be there and He doesn't hold a grudge.

I have also learned that the Holy Spirit dwells within us and that when we pray to Him we will have the strength to get through life's battles. When the Apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit, all fear left them and they went out and preached without regard as to what might happen to them. Again, all things through God are possible.

We are also supposed to give examples of Christ's presence in our lives. My family is Catholic and over the last two weeks I have been to two First Holy Communions. To see all the children in their innocence and excitement to receive God makes me feel that Christ is in my presence.

### **Bible Study Experience:**



### **Lesson Learned:**

When Simon Peter was tested, the Holy Spirit did talk to him, and Simon Peter make a decision not to listen to the Holy Spirit. The guilt from knowing that he (Simon Peter) denied Jesus three (3) times taught Simon Peter to trust in God, by listening and abiding to the Holy Spirit, in the decisions that he makes in life.

### **Life's Experiences:**

I believe that the Holy Spirit speaks to me all of the time. I believe that following the guidance of the Holy Spirit is a learned habit that we, as humans, must force ourselves to follow. For me, the voice of the Holy Spirit, once identified as such, makes my actions (or in-actions) easier to follow. How I should treat others?. How I should react to various situations? How should I inspire others? How should I lead by example? These are all questions that God, through the voice of the Holy Spirit, has provided me with guidance. It is up to me to take that guidance to heart and to follow God's suggested path.

## Simon Peter

I always enjoy the smaller group Bible Studies. I think it helps to gain a better understanding.

Simon met Jesus when his brother Andrew, after he and another disciple had spent the day with him, said to him, "we have found the Messiah" and brought him to Jesus. Then Jesus looked at him and said you are son of John, you will be called Cephas, meaning Peter, (which means Rock) and on this Rock I will build my Church. How great to share with a sibling the news of the Messiah. My brother, who we just lost earlier this year always believed, but had not attended church since childhood, said it isn't necessary as he read his Bible all the time. My sister and I always encouraged him to go and tell him of our church and church family. During his last couple of years he did join a nearby church and became very active in it. He told us he should have done so sooner and how glad we never gave up on him. How comforted we were to know he had found a church home and was able to be closer to our Savior.

When Jesus was teaching, the crowd had pressed in around him and seeing Simon's boat got in and asked him to row out a little way from shore where he continued to teach. After the crowd left Jesus had Simon row out further and told him to cast out his nets. Simon explained that they had not caught anything the whole night and he would do so only because Jesus asked him to. He then had such a huge catch that the nets were splitting. At this point Simon fell at Jesus knees and said, "Go away from me Lord I am a sinful man." Then Jesus said "Don't be afraid, from now on you will be fishers few men". So Simon Peter, his brother Andrew and James & John, the sons of Zebedee their partners, left everything and followed Jesus The first four apostles.

In four of the Gospels we learned that Peter who was good, bad, and impulsive, was also a faithful disciple. Simon and the other disciples were viewed as poor, uneducated, lower class and people who were not careful in observance of the Law, but Peter spoke with eloquence and power about the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Jesus knew that one day the “Rock” would live unto his name. Peter was married and lived in the home of his mother-in-law and it is believed that Jesus lived in the same home during his ministry.

Peter loved and had faith in Jesus but became frightened when he had asked Jesus to call him to step out of his boat to walk on water to him, when he took his eyes off the Lord and started to sink he called out “Lord rescue me” and Jesus reached out his hand and lifted Peter up.

This reminds me that God has done this for me so many times when life seems busy and over whelming. He has always been there to rescue me and many others who are around me, we just need to ask and Jesus loves to answer our prayers.

Peter was again the first one to say, when Jesus asked, the disciples, who do you say I am? You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God was Peter’s immediate answer. Later when Jesus had told His disciples there would be deserters because of Him, Peter said he never would. Jesus told him before the cock crows you deny me three times. Peter emphatically repeated I will not deny you. We all know that Peter did deny him 3’s before the cock crowed. I can be guilty of making promises and then time and circumstances change and that promise is broken. Peter was not infallible.

After Jesus resurrection He met with Peter and the Apostles on the shore where he called them to cast their nets on the other side of their boat and after a night of nothing, they had a great catch. That was when Peter seemed to recognize who was calling to them from shore. Jesus prepared a meal for them and gave Peter a chance to redeem himself by asking him 3 times, do you truly love me, and Peter was hurt that Jesus would ask him 3 times when he said You know that I do each time. Each time Jesus told him to feed my lambs, take care of my sheep and again feed my sheep. Our God is always looking for us to turn back and be his child again.

Peter was the one God chose to bring the word to the Gentiles and we would come to believe. Peter proved to be the Rock that Jesus had



## Post Office Food Drive




### News From Richard Lee

## Books Available in the Library By Kay Norfleet

### June 2019 Book Reviews

Recently at a college graduation the speaker focused on reminding the graduates that their greatest job was to go out into the world and SERVE: That they should always remember that the needs of the other person they had contact with were there because that would allow them to Serve them. "The Power of Gratitude" contains reminders of how often we should show serve and gratitude. WE SHOULD BE GRATEFUL TO GOD THAT WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE! OFTEN! In this book there are stories, short and to the point, of what constitutes gratitude. And what is one way we can obtain gratitude? That way is when our Heavenly Father allows us to SERVE others. Even if those others do not show their feelings, we know that we have supplied a need, whether it be substantive ...tactile or thought-filled...encouraging ... somehow fulfilling an essential for someone else gives us more and more a purpose.

In meeting needs our perspective is changed...changing how we view people is sometimes a gradual thing. But didn't our Lord ask us, gently, to do just that?

"The Surprising Grace of Disappointment" the second book is further explained by the additional title: ""Finding Hope When God SEEMS to Fail Us." We've all, I think, wondered about certain prayer outcomes in our lives. Does God hear our supplications?

"God, of course, is never truly absent. There is no place we can go to escape His presence.(Ps. 139:7-12)... That we know, yet... . One reason God seems absent is because of sin's intrusion." That is a thought to give us HOPE. What we can be sure of is that if God determines it to be to HIS advantage, and not sinful, He will finish that work. If it is sinful, then by putting off an answer, God will show us how we need to change. Or perhaps, the answer will be more beneficial in the future. So, it seems to me, that persistent prayer and contemplation are needed.. . and maybe we will receive enlightenment as to the result. If we focus and meditate and really try...I'm sure we will see what our good God is doing.

"We have no right to command much less make demands of God. We are at His beck and call. He is not at ours." He is the God who cares for us, yet decides when and where He will answer our supplications.. Remember He is the one in control and He cares for you and me.

"Don't Sweat the Small Stuff-and it's all small stuff" or "Simple Ways to keep the Little Things from Taking over Your Life." For example, if you pass by a house that hasn't been kept up, instead of judging it to be owned by a person of low values, change your perspective. Perhaps that person is for whatever reason not able to keep it up-maybe you'd offer a prayer, or here's an idea-offer a helping hand. Whatever you do, don't forget to pray for the owner. God knows what the reason is and He'd like someone to acknowledge it. In other words, God has made the people in the world to take care of each other. Don't just think of yourself. When you awake in the morning, first of all, thank God. Second focus your thoughts...maybe ask God who to focus on. Then pray for that person. Remember, you are not a priority...don't sweat it...go outside your comfort zone. And, you know what, you will benefit and stress less. Could this be another form of evangelizing?

### **Was Peter A Failure or Success?**

If you only read the Gospel accounts in the Bible you could say Peter was a failure and several examples can be found to support that. First was the storm on the lake and then his telling Jesus the plan of suffering and death was a bad plan. Then he refused to let Jesus wash his feet in the Upper Room. Finally he sleeps in Gethsemane while Jesus prays in anguish and then denies being a disciple.

But after the resurrection when the apostles were hiding in fear Jesus comes and gives them the Holy Spirit in power, wisdom and faith in John 20:20-22. They were born again and made leaders, not just followers. They would become the preachers and teachers when Jesus was taken up to heaven again after 40 days with them (Acts 1:2-5). At Pentecost the apostles and disciples were gathered in Jerusalem when the spirit came down on all of them waiting in faith (Acts 2:1-4). Now Peter was speaking boldly and trying to convince the Jews to accept Jesus as the Christ or promised Messiah. He had become the leader or head spokesman.

Now Peter was the chief of apostles, given great wisdom and power, even to heal the sick or dead (Tabitha in Acts 10). The weakest of the 12 apostles had become the chosen leader and Spirit-filled. We see Peter becoming like Paul; even being released from prison supernaturally by invisible angels to continue preaching (Acts 12:6-11). The Church or Bride of Christ was born and full of joy and power. God knew of Peter's potential and gave him the needed power and faith to be a success!


