

Leviticus(the book of the Bible after Exodus).

Leviticus is a book of the Bible about the Levites. In the book, God gave some rules only to the Levites, however the purpose of all the laws was for God's people(at that time the Israelites) as to how they should worship and live. A key statement is in 11:44-45 "Be Holy because I am Holy."

Aaron and his sons were the high priests at that time. God had some direction for them; sin offerings were to be just so AND, most important, they were to teach the Israelites the Lord's decrees given to them by Moses.

Hopefully we chose to remember that Biblical times are not our times. BUT God is not to be trifled with...we MUST think about the actual life then and apply God's words to NOW. For instance, we don't give burnt offerings anymore...but the offerings must be in good shape, pleasing to God.

We don't kill people who have committed sins...but they must be accountable and realize that the sins enumerated are not to be repeated.

Many of our sanitation rules come from this book: regulations about disease and food. God cares for us. We should be careful to review all.

But in the sexual sins, it is not necessary to adjust our thinking, it is pretty clear what offends God. And I believe that we want to be very careful and not commit the sins that offend God (Chapter 20:10-21).

Remember the day of rest. God did after Creation.

This is important because God saw a need for it then as NOW.

And don't give your gifts to Him unless they are given willingly And in good shape.

God doesn't want your castoffs. God Does want you to happily give your best to Him because you realize and are thankful for all He's done.

In Chapter 26: 14-39 are the verses which spell out disobedience. The consequences are severe for not repenting...not changing our ways...not realizing that it is God who is IN CONTROL, not you or your feelings.

We have a lot to learn from Leviticus because the writings center on God and what God can and cannot tolerate. (Remember NOT to skim over admonishments that you believe are not appropriate for these time, such as burnt offerings. Instead think and pray about how God would want you to keep these.
